All,

Here are Anne and my questions /concerns.

- 1) That Norton will become subsumed into Daventry and lose its village identity. Coupled with this concern is that crime may increase alongside any housing increase
- 2) The sewage farm is already known to be operating at full capacity so cannot cope with further housing. What plans would there be to address this?
- 3) There is already too great a flow of traffic through the village and an increase would be dangerous, especially for children and the elderly. We would like to know at what stage in any development we could expect to see traffic calming measures implemented
- 4) The impact on wildlife would be devastating, especially for bats, foxes and badgers. Also concerned at loss of hedgerow used by birds and bats. We would therefore like to see plans to address such concerns
- 5) We are concerned about an increase in light pollution from any increase in housing
- 6) As it is likely that we will have some form of development forced upon us then we wish to see some benefits. This could be provision of gas into the village. We understand plans to improve broadband are already in hand. We do not wish to see an increase in amenities as this appears to be a reason why Norton is deemed to have plans for small scale development.
- 7. What garuante do we have that the lorries for the Daventry infrastructure will not come through Norton?
